#### CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

St Michael's School is a co-educational Catholic primary school comprised of 70 students from Kindergarten to Year 6 and serves the Brunswick parish which is situated in south west of WA 150km from Perth. St Michael's School is a welcoming community, embracing the Gospel values of faith, hope and love. Through Christian witness, we offer a safe and supportive learning environment for the families in our school community. St Michael's offers an education that aims to promote the development of each student as a responsible, inner - directed Christian person. The school provides a relevant, comprehensive and varied curriculum to cater for a wide range of student needs, interests and abilities. Our Personalised Learning approach supported by technology enables our students to work co-operatively and develop inquiry skills to become lifelong learners. There is a strong emphasis on literacy and numeracy learning and integration of technology across learning areas. Small class sizes allow for individual and small group learning, as well as whole class teaching. Specialist programs are offered in Music, Art, Italian, Physical Education and Library.

#### SATISFACTION

#### 1.1 Staff Satisfaction

Drawing on the data from the SRC Insight Surveys, staff indicated a high level of satisfaction with the school. They continued to express a strong view that St Michael's was a positive and welcoming community with strong community involvement. They believed the school to be strong educationally with a strong faith dimension. Teachers value the professional sharing and open communication they have with each other. Staff feel appreciated and supported in their roles, and the climate of teamwork is apparent. Staff members are appreciative of how well the school is resourced. They believe they have a very user friendly level of technology in their classrooms. Opportunities are also provided for reflection and input on school programs, policies and practices. Teachers appreciate the partnerships they have with parents in the interests of the education of students. Support of class programs by way of P&F fundraising is greatly appreciated. However, there were areas identified that require further improvement as outlined below:

- Professional growth
- Curriculum processes
- Staff opportunity

#### 1.2 Parent Satisfaction

The majority of parents regularly express either satisfaction or a high level of satisfaction with the school. The SRC Insight Survey indicated that parents valued the school highly with most areas well above the state average. Regular use of the student feedback to provide feedback and encouragement was also appreciated.

Three areas of strength were identified by the survey:

- Reporting
- Connectedness to peers
- Christian Service

Parents commented on the welcoming atmosphere that prevails at St Michael's.

#### 1.3 Student Satisfaction

The SRC Insight Survey and class, group and one-on-one discussions with teachers and other staff members suggest a high level of satisfaction among students. They believe that St Michael's is a friendly school, has lots of sporting equipment and that they have nice teachers. Having good friends to play with, people who are kind to you and care about you, adults and children, and going on excursions were rated highly, as were sporting events.

The senior students considered they were receiving a good education and were pleased that the technology at the school continues to advance.

#### POST-SCHOOL DESTINATIONS

The majority of Year 6 students attend Year 7 at Bunbury Catholic College (Mercy Campus), with one student attending Australind Senior High School and one at Bunbury Cathedral Grammar.
